-- Archbishop Stigant (sometimes spelt Stigand)

-- Latin

11 What other ship does this Norman ship resemble?

-- Viking longboat

13 What name does this give us?

-- Starboard

14 Write down two days of the week and where their names came from

SUNDAY - Sun's Day. Germanic translation of the Roman 'Day of the Sun'.

MONDAY - Moon's Day. Germanic translation of the Roman 'Day of the Moon'.

TUESDAY - Tyr's Day. Named for the Norse/Teutonic God.

WEDNESDAY - Woden's Day. Named for the Norse/Teutonic God.

THURSDAY - Thor's Day. Named for the Norse/Teutonic God

FRIDAY - Freya's Day. Named for the Norse/Teutonic Goddess.

SATURDAY - Saturn's Day. Germanic translation of the Roman 'Day of Saturn'.

15 Write down two months and where their names came from

JANUARY - named after Janus, god of beginnings.

FEBRUARY - named for Februa, the feast of purification.

MARCH - from Latin Martius, (month of) Mars.

APRIL - The name may derive from the Greek goddess of love, Aphrodite.

MAY - From the Greek Maia, goddess of spring (growth).

JUNE - From Latin mensis Junius, after the goddess Juno, queen of the gods.

JULY - From Latin Julius (Caesar) after whom it was named in 44 BC. The original name was quintilis, fifth month in the early Roman calendar.

AUGUST - From Latin Augustus (Caesar) 8 BC. The original name was Sextilis, sixth month in the early Roman calendar.

SEPTEMBER - seventh month in early Roman calendar (Sept = seven in Latin and French)

OCTOBER - eighth month in the early Roman calendar

NOVEMBER - ninth month of the early Roman calendar, from Latin novem = nine

DECEMBER - December, tenth month of the early Roman calendar
